FOR INDOOR SAUNAS

TREATING THE EXTERIOR

You don't need to treat the exterior of your sauna, but if you wish to do so, a local paint store can suggest a suitable exterior stain. Follow the directions from the stain manufacturer for application instructions. NEVER TREAT THE INTERIOR OF THE SAUNA AND NEVER USE VARNISH OR PAINT ON THE EXTERIOR.

CLEANING THE INTERIOR

You should vacuum or brush out your sauna periodically to remove loose dirt. Over time the seats and optional duckboard floor sections of your sauna may discolor due to perspiration, dirt and general wear. You can remove dirt or stains with a solution of baking soda and water; lightly scrub the wood with the solution and then rinse. Use fine grit sandpaper to sand out heavier stains or scuffs.

REPLACEMENT OF SAUNA STONES

Over time your sauna stones may crack and split due to the temperature fluctuations the stones experience. If you ever need to replace any, only use stones designed for use in your sauna heater. You can buy replacement stones from Almost Heaven Saunas anytime.

REPLACEMENT PARTS

If you ever damage the exterior of the sauna, you can purchase replacement components from Almost Heaven Saunas at any time. Also, we sell hemlock, fir, and cedar boards to people building matching accents to their sauna. Contact us anytime for prices on any boards you may need to customize your sauna setting.
